

Decision of Institutional Thematic Assessment

The attainment level of the goals of the National Institute of Technology, Ishikawa College is satisfactory in the area of Institutional Thematic Assessment, Theme A: Research Activities.

The attainment level of the goals of the National Institute of Technology, Ishikawa College is good in the area of Institutional Thematic Assessment, Theme B: Community Outreach.

The review committee has identified the following best practices in the area of Institutional Thematic Assessment B:

- 1) For upper elementary school students, the College holds a KOSEN Summer Seminar for Elementary School Students and offers classrooms to experience the fun of science. The advanced course students prepared part of the experience course. Simultaneously, an on-campus tour is held, which is an opportunity to introduce the school. More than 200 pairs of parents and children participate every year, and it has been well received from the participant questionnaire.
- 2) The College is implementing exchange projects and training programs such as human resource development courses in collaboration with the NITIC Industry-Academia Exchange Association for Technology Promotion. In addition, it holds a company technology briefing session every year to let students know the technology of member companies. The number of participating companies is increasing, and it is functioning effectively as part of student career education.

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
