

China

- › Chinese Policy to attract international universities. 10 designated cities. Ningbo-Nottingham was first branch campus in China.
- › Yantai eager to attract a top university. Highly-qualified personnel needed for factories and laboratories.
- › Finances: costs for reconstruction and equipment of the campus, (300 million euro) rent, housing, supporting staff, costs of gas and electricity to be paid by Chinese partners



On 26 October 2015 Sibrand Poppema and Ke Bingsheng, the Presidents of the University of Groningen and China Agricultural University respectively, and Mayor Zhang Yongxia of Yantai signed the financial agreement to establish the University of Groningen Yantai (UGY). King Willem-Alexander of the Netherlands and President Xi Jinping of the People's Republic of China attended the ceremony. The University of Groningen wants to be the first Dutch university to open a branch campus in China.



History of an international university





Programme preferences

This reports looks specifically at the top fifteen countries of origin of international degree students enrolled in Dutch higher education, in 2016–17. Together these nationalities represent 64% of all 80,000+ international degree students in the Netherlands. Neighbouring countries (Germany, Belgium, the United Kingdom), southern and eastern European countries, and Asian countries constitute the most important regions of origin, which is as such reflected in the top fifteen.




Figure 2: Percentage share of international degree students enrolled in universities of applied sciences and research universities, for the top 15 nationalities enrolled in the Netherlands 2016–17.

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


Figure 2: Percentage share of international degree students enrolled in universities of applied sciences and research universities, for the top 15 nationalities enrolled in the Netherlands 2016–17.





Figure 9: Degree students from Asia in the Netherlands higher education, 2016–17.

The technical universities of Delft, Wageningen and Eindhoven feature prominently among the most popular institutions, as do the universities of Rotterdam, Groningen and Amsterdam – mainly for Business. Due to their preference for technically oriented programmes, international students from Asia contribute significantly to achieving the goals of the *Techniekpact*.⁹

Planning of a broad research university

- › Start: 4 Bachelor's programmes and 2 Master's programmes (FSE, Spatial Sciences).
 - Bachelor's degree programmes in Chemistry, Industrial Engineering & Management, Life Sciences & Technology and Mathematics.
Aim: attract 100 students to each Bachelor's programme
 - Master's programmes in Chemical Engineering and Environmental and Infrastructure Planning.
Aim: attract 50 to each Master's programme

Ultimately: additional degree programmes from different faculties, in total : 20 Bachelor's programmes and 10 Master's programmes.



BEIJING. Dat er op Chinese universiteiten steeds minder sprake is van academische vrijheid was al langer bekend. Nu blijkt dat die ook op de campus van buitenlandse universiteiten in China niet langer is gegarandeerd. Een Britse academicus is uit het bestuur van de Chinese campus van zijn Britse universiteit gezet omdat hij een kritisch stuk schreef over de Communistische Partij van China (CPC).

Dat is ook voor Nederlandse universiteiten relevant. Zo had de Rijksuniversiteit Groningen (RUG) tot voor kort vergevorderde plannen om in China een eigen campus te beginnen. Volgens het college van bestuur zou er op die dependance geen sprake zijn van inperking van de academische vrijheid. De Universiteitsraad geloofde dat echter niet. Het plan van de RUG werd uiteindelijk eerder dit jaar afgeblazen.

Het wantrouwen blijkt nu terecht. De Britse academicus Stephen Morgan mag niet langer deel uitmaken van het bestuur van de University of Nottingham Ningbo. Zakenkrant *Financial Times* meldt op basis van anonieme bronnen dat dit komt doordat Morgan zich te kritisch heeft uitgelaten over het 19de partijcongres van de Communistische Partij van China (CPC). Tijdens het meest recente congres werd de Chinese president Xi Jinping in principe voor het leven benoemd. Morgan schreef het stuk niet voor een publicatie van de universiteit in Ningbo, maar voor een internetpublicatie van de moederuniversiteit in Nottingham.

De University of Nottingham Ningbo werd in 2004 geopend als de eerste joint

Morgan werd niet meteen na verschijnen van zijn stuk ontslagen als bestuurslid. Pas toen het tijd werd om zijn contract te verlengen, maakten vertegenwoordigers van de CPC aan het bestuur duidelijk dat een herbenoeming er voor Morgan niet in zat. Het stuk van Morgan had in hun ogen de universiteit in verlegenheid gebracht. Morgan blijft wel aan als docent. Morgan en het universiteitsbestuur zeggen overigens dat het gaat om een reguliere en gebruikelijke vernieuwing van het bestuur.

De zaak is niet alleen relevant in het licht van berichten dat de CPC onder Xi de teugels op Chinese universiteiten steeds strakker aanhaalt. Zo is het moeilijker geworden om buitenlands materiaal bij colleges te gebruiken en is er steeds vaker cameratoezicht in de collegezalen. Het ontslag werpt ook een nieuw licht op de jarenlange discussie die er op de Rijksuniversiteit Groningen (RUG) werd gevoerd over het wel of niet openen van een campus in de Oost-Chinese stad Yantai.

Bij die discussie draaide het vooral om de vraag of de academische vrijheid in China te garanderen zou zijn. Het college van bestuur onder leiding van Sibrand Poppema meende van wel, maar de Universiteitsraad bleef twijfels houden. Toen de Universiteitsraad begin dit jaar in meerderheid van plan bleek tegen de plannen voor Yantai te stemmen, trok het bestuur de plannen voor de campus in.

„Samen met de faculteiten en opleidingen onderzoeken we de komende tijd welke andere vormen van samenwerking in Yantai mogelijk zijn”, zei Poppema toen. Poppema wordt per 1 oktober opgevolgd door Jouke de Vries. Of, en zo ja in welke vorm, de RUG onder zijn leiding doorgaat met de samenwerking met Yantai is nog onbekend.



University of Groningen to reconsider plans for Yantai campus in China

The Board of the University of Groningen has decided not to submit its proposal to offer transnational education in Yantai to the Minister of Education, Culture and Science. The Board of the University regrets this, but there is insufficient support within the University Council for this proposal.

President of the Board Sibrand Poppema: 'This means that the Board of the University will cancel its plans to offer entire degree programmes under the responsibility of the UG in Yantai. In the near future we will investigate, together with the faculties and degree programmes, which other forms of collaboration are possible in Yantai.' The Board of the University will immediately inform all parties involved of this decision.

Internationalization is one of the most important aspects of the UG's strategic plan. It is an important instrument to improve quality and drive innovation and

To be continued, but slower pace

- > application for Transnational Education (TNE) can be drawn up for the Ministry of Education, Culture and Science, and put before the University Council for approval.
- > Ongoing agreements will continue, on the understanding that approval for TNE from the University Council and the Minister are a legal requirement.

A total of 122 thousand international students from 162 different countries are currently studying at a Dutch university or university of applied science, 10 thousand **more than last year**, according to an **analysis by Nuffic**. Dutch universities' continuing focus on attracting as many international students as possible is a worrying trend, according to student union LSVb.

According to Nuffic, the Dutch organization for internationalization in education, nearly 90 thousand of the international students are working on a complete degree in the Netherlands. The rest are here for a short time, for example on an
