Dr. Tsutomu Kimura has been President of NIAD-UE since 1998. His previous position was President of Tokyo Institute of Technology. He had served as academic staff at Tokyo Institute of Technology over 30 years, as a professional of the fields of Geotechnical Engineering and Soil Engineering. He has contributed to the development of quality assurance of higher education internationally. He was Board Member of INQAAHE from 2003 to 2005. He was Vice Chairman for Central Council for Education and a member of Science Council of Japan until 2007.

He received Master of Engineering from University of Tokyo and Doctoral Degree from Tokyo Institute of Technology. He was awarded the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire (C.B.E) in 2004.

Mr. Kimito Kubo has been Deputy Director-General, Higher Education Bureau of MEXT since 2007. He has served MEXT for nearly 30 years. During his career at MEXT, he held various positions including higher education and lifelong learning: Director, Personnel Division of Minister's Secretariat; Director, Minister's Secretariat; Deputy Director-General, Lifelong Learning Policy Bureau; Director, Private Education Institution Administration Division, Higher Education Bureau.



Concepcion V. Pijano

Executive Director, PAASCU (Philippine Accrediting Association of Schools, Colleges and Universities) APQN President

Concepcion V. Pijano is the President-designate of the Asia Pacific Quality Network and the Executive Director of the Philippine Accrediting Association of Schools, Colleges and Universities (PAASCU). She has worked in the field of academic accreditation since 1978 and has shared her experiences and expertise in accreditation with various institutions and organizations, both national and international. She has served as a consultant for accreditation and quality assurance in a number of countries in the Asia-Pacific region. At present, she is the adviser and consultant on quality assurance to the Accreditation Committee of Cambodia. She also serves as an accreditation specialist and resource person for the Asian Development Bank.

She has authored several manuals and tools for accreditation, conducted workshops on quality assurance systems for various countries and presented papers in both regional and international conferences. She holds an M.A. in Public Administration from Pace University in New York, U.S.A.



Peter Williams

Chief Executive, QAA (The Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education), UK

Peter Williams is a graduate in English from the University of Exeter. Following a brief spell as a management trainee with the British Printing Corporation, and three years in the Registry of the University of Surrey, he moved in 1974 to the University of Leicester, where he was in charge of the Higher Degrees Office. In 1978 he was promoted to Assistant Registrar in the Medical School, becoming Secretary of the School in 1982. From 1984 until 1990 he was the Deputy Secretary of the British Academy. In 1990 Peter was appointed as the first (and only) Director of the CVCP Academic Audit Unit (AAU), one of the first quality assurance agencies, and between 1992 and 1997 was the Director of the Quality Assurance Group of the Higher Education Quality Council (HEQC), which took over the responsibilities of the AAU. In August 1997 Peter became the Director of Institutional Review in the Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education (QAA), which was formed by a merger of HEQC and the quality assessment divisions of the UK's higher education funding councils. In August 2001 he additionally took on the role of Acting Chief Executive. In March 2002 he was appointed Chief Executive of QAA.

In addition to his work in the UK, Peter has lectured and made presentations in many other countries and has participated in a number of international quality assurance projects in Argentina, Australia, Azerbaijan, India, New Zealand, Poland, Romania, Sweden and the USA. In 2004-05 he was a Vice President, and in September 2005 was elected President, of the European Association for Quality Assurance in Higher Education (ENQA) and represents ENQA on the Bologna Follow-Up Group (BFUG). He was re-elected President of ENQA in 2006 and 2007.
