





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Shin-ichi Hirano Opening Remarks

President of NIAD-UE, Japan

National Institution for Academic Degrees and University Evaluation (NIAD-UE)

Dr. Shin-ichi Hirano became the President of NIAD-UE in April 2009. Before taking up this position, he was the President of Nagoya University from 2004 to 2009. His professional career started at Tokyo Institute of Technology in 1970. In the following years, he joined Nagoya University, where he held a senior position as well as served as a professional of Inorganic Materials Chemistry, Crystalline Growth and Materials Evaluation. He has contributed many services in national and international committees and academic societies. At present, he is a member of the National Council for Science and Technology, Japan. He is also the Chair Professor and Special Advisor to the President of Shanghai Jiao Tong University. He holds a D.Eng. from Nagoya University.



Anthony McClaran Opening Remarks

Chief Executive of QAA, UK

Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education (QAA)

Anthony McClaran took up post as Chief Executive of QAA on 1 October 2009, after nearly six years as Chief Executive at UCAS. He joined UCAS in 1995 to lead the then Academic Services and Development department, and was appointed Deputy Chief Executive a year later. He became Acting Chief Executive in January 2003 and was appointed Chief Executive in December of that year.

A graduate in English and American Literature from the University of Kent, Anthony began his career at the University of Warwick where, among other posts, he was Admissions Officer. In 1992 he moved to the University of Hull to take up the post of Academic Registrar, with responsibility for an office which included recruitment, admissions, student records, international affairs and the internal allocation of resources. In 1995 he was appointed Acting Registrar and Secretary. Anthony sat on the Council of the University of Gloucestershire from 1997 until 2005 and in September 2007 was appointed Chair of Council, a post he relinquished on taking up his QAA role. He served on Professor Schwartz's Admissions to HE Steering Group, the HE Group for the Tomlinson Review of 14-19 Qualifications, the SHA Commission on Post-qualification Application (PQA) and Sir Alan Wilson's Consultation Group on Improving the HE Applications Process.

He is a director of the Inspiring Futures Foundation, and a governor of the John Lyon School. Anthony also chairs Gloucestershire First's Employment and Skills Advisory Panel. He is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts and the Chartered Management Institute, a Freeman of the Company of Educators and a member of the Honourable Company of Gloucestershire.

Director of HEEC, China

Higher Education Evaluation Center of the Ministry of Education (HEEC)

Prof. Ji Ping was graduated from the Northwestern Polytechnical University. Having been engaged in the field of higher education long-term development research and annual project management, Prof. Ji participated in the policy-decision making process of the national educational undertaking reform with developing Ten-five and Eleven-five planning. Being a data craft of State Statistics Bureau, she was in charge of annual statistics management and analytical work of educational undertaking. Since 1987, Prof. Ji Ping took the posts as the vice section chief, division chief, vice chief of the Development Planning Department of Ministry of Education. In December 2007, she was appointed as the director of HEEC.

Ms. Stamenka Uvalić-Trumbić is Chief of the Reform, Innovation and Quality Assurance Section in the Division of Higher Education, UNESCO Headquarters in Paris from 2001 to the present day. She also worked as Programme specialist at UNESCO's European Centre for Higher Education, CEPES Bucharest, Romania (1990-1999). Prior to joining UNESCO, she was Secretary-General of the Association of Universities of Yugoslavia (1987-1990).

She has engaged in many international projects including: UNESCO-OECD partnership in developing the 2005 Guidelines for Quality Provision in Crossborder Higher Education; UNESCO-World Bank partnership 2008 Global Initiative for Capacity-building in Quality Assurance for Developing and Transition Countries (GIQAC); and UNESCO's World Conference on Higher Education (UNESCO, Paris, 2009) as Executive Secretary. She was awarded 'International Higher Education Professional of the Year 2009' by her peers in the International Community of Higher Education' (Washington, D.C., 28 January 2010).

From 1998 to 2009, Dr. Tsutomu Kimura was the president of NIAD-UE. In April 2009, he was appointed as an advisor to the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology. He started his professional career at Tokyo Institute of Technology, where he engaged in research and teaching in the field of Geotechnical Engineering over 30 years. From 1993 to 1997, he was the president of Tokyo Institute of Technology. On retiring from Tokyo Institute of Technology, he changed the field of his activities from engineering to quality assurance of higher education. He was a board member of INQAAHE from 2003 to 2005. He was the vice chairman for Central Council for Education and a member of Science Council of Japan until 2007. He received Master of Engineering from University of Tokyo and Doctoral Degree from Tokyo Institute of Technology. He was awarded the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire (C.B.E) in 2004.

Carolyn Campbell MA LLB (University of Glasgow)

Carolyn Campbell is currently Head of International Affairs at the Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education (QAA), UK, with responsibility for strategic policy advice on international quality assurance and for the management of the Agency's international collaboration activities. Prior to this she was a senior staff member at the Higher Education Quality Council and a policy adviser in the Education Development Centre at the University of Roehampton.

In the early 1990s, she worked on secondment at the Erasmus Bureau on the development and management of the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) pilot project. She has continued involvement in European matters through membership of the UK Bologna Stakeholders Group and involvement in the activities of the UK Higher Education Europe Unit. Carolyn is a member of the Advisory Board of the Observatory on Borderless Higher Education and of the Student Experience Advisory Group for the Prime Minister's Initiative on International Education. Carolyn has contributed articles on transnational education and quality assurance to EC, OECD and Observatory publications and was a member of the expert group that developed the OECD-UNESCO guidelines on quality provision in cross border education.

She has served as a consultant for accreditation in many countries, such as Laos, Cambodia, Bangladesh, Mongolia, Indonesia, Yemen, China and Egypt. In addition, she is an accreditation specialist and resource person for international agencies, such as the World Bank, the Asian Development Bank and the UNESCO. She has authored several manuals and tools for accreditation, conducted workshops on accreditation systems for various countries, advised governments on quality assurance issues and presented papers in both regional and international conferences.

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
National Institution for Academic Degrees and University Evaluation (NIAD-UE, Japan)
